CONCLUSIONS & PROPOSAL

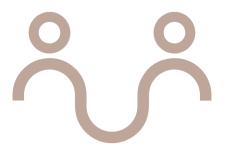
The location of the site consists of both commercial and residential areas. The commercial spaces are composed of high-end luxury retail stores which help magnify the economic and aesthetic value of the neigborhood of Little Haiti. Meanwhile, the residential areas sorrounding the commercial are mostly populated by middle to lower income class individuals, which creates a **conflict between the site and the community of Little Haiti**

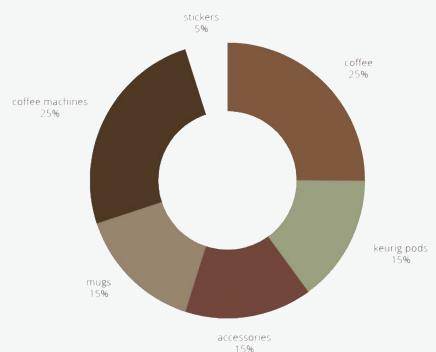
BRAND INSPIRATION

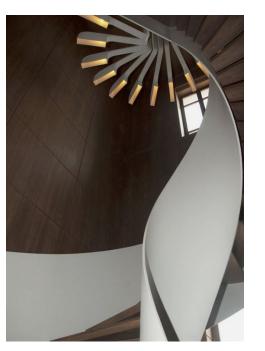




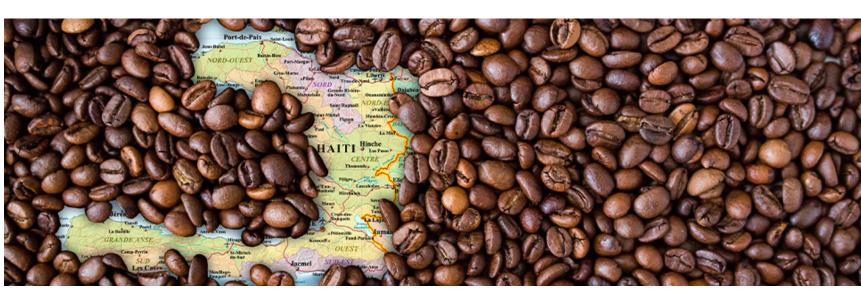
















CONCEPT

The main goal of this project is to unify the Little Haiti and Miami Design District communities to decrease the negative effects of gentrification in the area. To accomplish this we are creating a coffee shop/pottery studio that offers job opportunities, education, and incorporates a large retail space focused around Haitian coffee, something that is essential in their culture. The design will utilize warm, rich tones to represent the mellow taste and notes of chocolate of Haitian coffee.









For the concept model we created a hanging basket chair that utilizes the concepts of circles from the Fly's Eye Dome in the Miami Design District, along with the colors from the Haitian coffee plant, the arabica, and the fluidity from the coffee art.



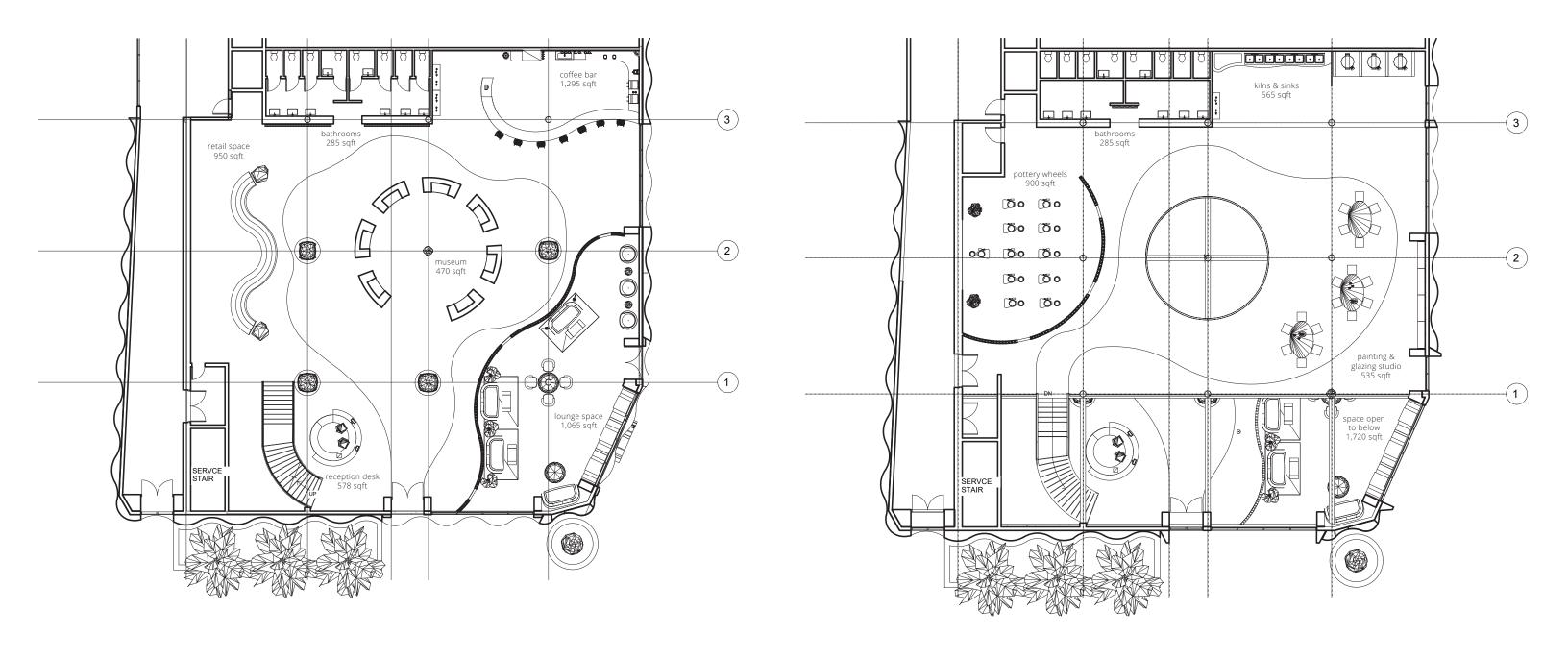
