


This design studio aims to introduce the planning of interior environments, adressing both the contents of the environment and the process of interior space planning




A4-Building Analysis: structure

the house consists of two stories one stair case has 16 steps there are no columns present there are lots of windows present allowing for natural light







A4- Building Analysis: dominant issues

LOCATION


The site for the house is located right next to Biscayne Bay. This is important to pay attention to while desiging the site because water levels can have a large impact on the structure of the house. One also has to consider the distance from the water that anything is built due to flooding or high tides in the area. Moisture levels in the air also play a big role.


STRUCTURE


There is only one staircase present that leads up from the first floor to the second floor. This is imporant to note because this limits the overall circulation.

SPATIAL

The floor plan for the house shows a considerably smaller square footage on the second floor in comparison to the first floor. The total sq footage for the first floor of the house comes out to be around 3,285 sq ft while the second floor only encompasses 1,860 sq ft. This is an important factor to consider when desiging the rooms and understanding how the spaces will work out.








the majority of spaces outdoors and on the first floor and appear to be public the second floor consists mainly of semi-private space with the exception of the overlook by the interior balcony



A5- Program Analysis: design guidelines

to create an open floor plan by using minimal walls and gapped partitions

have a large kitchen, bar, and gym/yoga space to tailor towards the clients individual interests and hobbies

to create a fun and welcoming outdoors area for the clients, their athletic daughter and guests (this includes the patio area, bbq area, and pool with a removeable volleyball net)

to make the home easily accessible for when clients host guests, and have a fluid floor plan with lots of room for activites and socializing

individual spaces

entry

enclosed to create seperation between the indoor and outdoor spaces space to greet people as they walk through the door

mudroom/laundry room: 222.5 sqft

space next to garage enough room for washer, dryer, and shoe/coat storage

garage: 388 sqft

space connected to the back of the house garage door opens on the western facade room for two cars and some extra storage living room: 314.8 sqff

large space for socializing and relaxing close to 1/2 bath on first floor smooth circulation to dining room and kitchen

dining room: 203.9 sqft

close to entry with smooth circulation to living room and kitchen formal dining area used when company comes over close to 1/2 bath

breakfast nook: 176.6 sqff

cozy space to eat breakfast with the family access to patio and pool/bbq area through back door plenty of natural light and high ceilings enough space for a small table

individual spaces

kitchen: 358.8 sqff

large space with island and smooth circulation throughout high ceilings and larger windows allowing for plenty of natural light

close to breakfast nook and dining room

pantry: 52.2 sqff

small walk-in pantry with enough room to store extra food and snacks

close to kitchen to allow easy access

1/2 bath: 34.2 sqff

located on the first floor near the dining room and kitchen for easy access private area in a public space Office: 90 sqft

enough space to put a desk and storage for event planning materials

windows to provide natural light throughout the day private work/study space

bathroom: 70 sqft

full bath with enough room for a large shower, toliet, and sink directly connected to the guest bedroom located left of the front door to allow easy access for the guest

guest bedroom: 128.1 sqff

small bedroom with enough space for a queen bed and dresser private area direct access to guest bathroom

individual spaces

master bedroom: 593.4 sqff

second floor of the house private area enough space for a california king, sidetables, and vanity area

master bath: 238 saft

huge bathroom with enough room for a large shower, toliet, jacuzzi tub, two sinks, two vanity cabinets, and a small sauna windows to allow natural light

walk-in closet: 180 sqff

attached to the master bedroom and master bath large room with enough space for hanging clothes racks, jewelry storage, furniture, and mirrors private space thats accessible to both parents second bedroom: 270.8 sqff

smaller bedroom with plenty of natural light enough space for a queen bed, nightstand, desk, and vanity area under bed storage

bathroom: 104.2 sqff

smaller full bath with enough room for a large shower, toliet, vanity cabinet and sink private area

walk-in closet: 103.5 sqff

slightly smaller then the master walk-in enough space for drawers, hanging clothing racks, and mirrors attached to bedroom on the second floor

individual spaces

home gym/yoga: 400 sqft

easy access from the master bedroom fully equipped home gym with space to do yoga gorgeous views of the venetian causeway

linen closet: 26.6 sqff

small closet for extra towels and bedding located on the second floor

bbq area: 385 sqft

large area to hang out by the pool shade provided from the hot florida sun easy access to the pool and back patio located at the back of the property near the waterfront closet: 18.3 sqft

located in the living room on the first floor of the house space to store extra blankets and linens hidden area

patio: 294.4 sqft

located on the northern facade of the house close to bbq/pool area smooth transition from indoor to outdoor areas

A6- Design Concept




The main goal of this project is to provide the clients with a home that encompasses both public and private spaces, utilizing an open floor plan. Some of the dominant features within the program include a spacious kitchen, plenty of open floor space for events/gatherings, a home gym/yoga studio, and a large walk in closet. The design will be organic-modern with a foundation of clean lines, rounded shapes, and smooth surfaces.

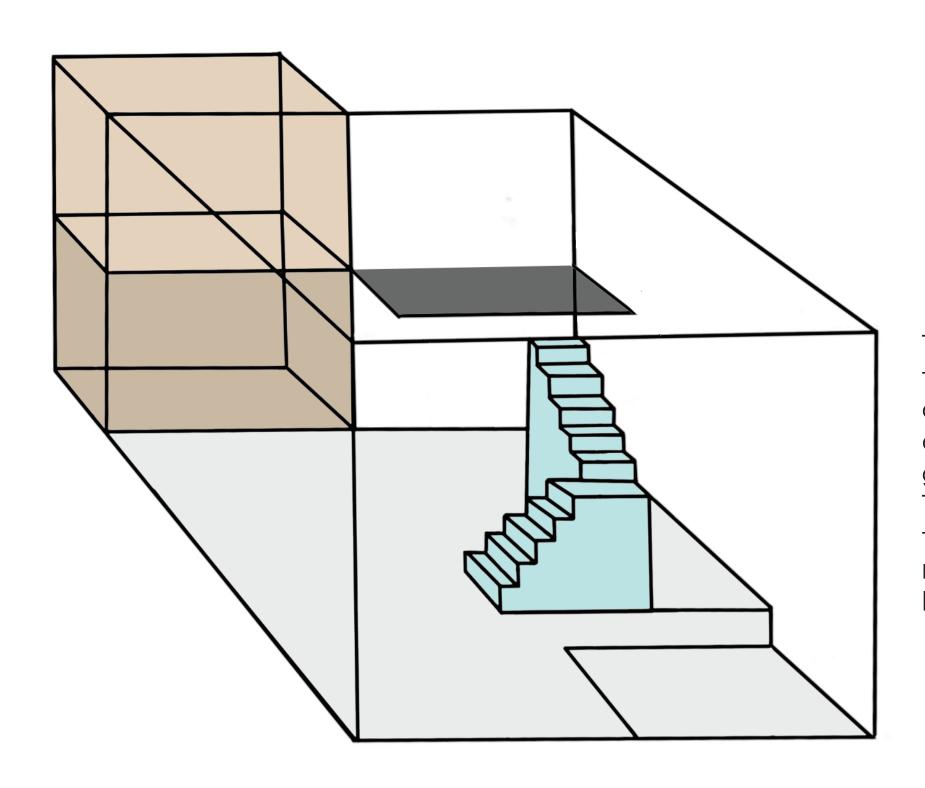
Adjacency Diagram second floor

This diagram shows the relationship between the first and second floor of the house. The darker shade of tan represents the garage and the lighter shade represents the home gym/yoga space located directly above. The light blue shows the steps that connect the two levels and lastly the dark grey shade represents the mezzanine located about the kitchen/breakfast nook.




RCP Plan first floor
